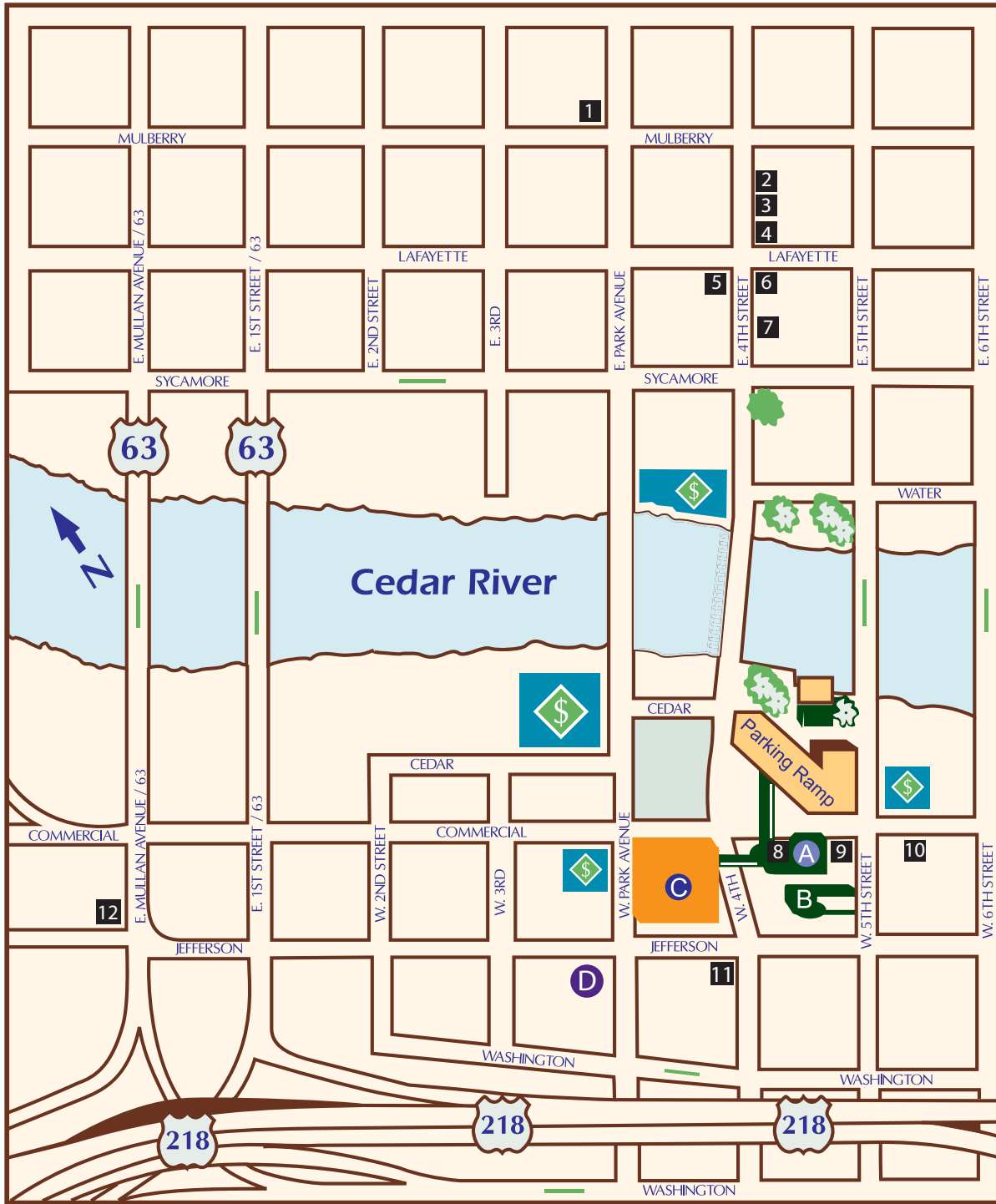

# Places to go and things to do in downtown Waterloo

## Across the bridge:

- 1 Elks Lodge, 407 E. Park Avenue, 319-234-7568**

The Elks now features the Park Lounge bar with leather seating, soaring ceilings and the requisite elk mounts. The contemporary restaurant, Gatsby's, serves lunch and dinner including their signature dish, Crown Roast of Pork.
- 2 Monicas, 324 East 4th Street, (319) 233-1319**

This upscale piano bar featuring spectacular martinis has reopened under new ownership and is a great addition to the downtown entertainment district.
- 3 CU, 320 E. Fourth, 319-274-8888.**

One of Waterloo's finest dining establishments, CU's menu is eclectic and changes seasonally. Reservations recommended.
- 3 The Cellar, 320 E. Fourth Street,** located in the lower level of CU. This bar offers an extensive wine list, a unique atmosphere and a diverse crowd of regulars.
- 4 Jameson's, 310 E. Fourth St.**

Jameson's boasts an exquisite décor and a large selection of Irish beers and whiskeys. Smokers step outside, please, to a comfortable patio, complete with chairs and tables.
- 5 Barbados Bar & Restaurant, 229 E. 4th St., 319-939-4511**

Downtown Waterloo's newest addition, this tropical-themed bar beckons you to dance in the "Boom Boom" room and enjoy island food and drink.
- 6 Screaming Eagle American Bar and Grill, 228 E. Fourth St.** On the bottom floors Fowler Building including a basement bar dubbed "The Pit," the Eagle encompasses all things American – rock 'n' roll, sports, movies and, of course, Harley Davidson.

## This side of the river:

- 8 Red River Restaurant & Bar, in the Ramada Inn.** This restaurant and bar features delicious dining from their own smokehouse as well as a pool table, dartboards and more.
- 9 Galleria de Paco, 622 Commercial St. 319-833-7226**

Paco Rosic, a Bosnian immigrant, painted a replica of the Sistine Chapel on the ceiling of this establishment using Krylon spray paint. The downstairs bar is open daily. The upstairs dining room is small and requires reservations in advance.
- 10 The Brown Bottle, 209 W. Fifth St., 319-232-3014.** For more than 30 years, the Landau family has been serving Italian food and pizza that some maintain is the best in town. Attire is casual; food and service are consistently good.
- 11 Doughy Joey's, Fourth and Jefferson Streets** (right across from the convention center). Pizza is the star, but the menu also features salads and sandwiches.

**Coffee:** *(in Waterloo there is not a Starbucks around every corner.)*

- 7 Cottonwood Canyon, 218 E. Fourth St.,** Gourmet coffee custom-roasted by Jamaican-born Randolph Bryan. Café also features a breakfast and sandwich menu. Well worth the trip over the bridge. Hours are Monday-Thursday 7 a.m. to 7 p.m., Friday and Saturday, 8 a.m. to 11 p.m.
